Summary report

What is the overall impact of spending?

Pupils in YR and KS1 have closed gaps in phonics learning. Pupils have returned to school and learning in a calm and settled way due to the support that was in place and the focus on closing gaps and developing key skills. The additional support and training means that staff were better equipped to support pupils and families.

How will changes be communicated to parents and stakeholders?

Parents, staff and governors were notified via newsletters and the school website

Final comments

The focus on cores skills and knowledge has meant a smoother transition to school-based learning from remote learning than had been envisaged. Whilst there are still issues and concerns, we have a stable platform to work from and some well-established practices and procedures to draw on. There is a carried forward amount of £1,904.16 which will be used in the academic year 2021/22 to continue with sourcing additional to support with phonics and early reading, and with catch up in Years 5 and 6.
