



Communication and Language
 Sing a large repertoire of songs
 Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver."

Physical Development
 Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips.
 Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues.

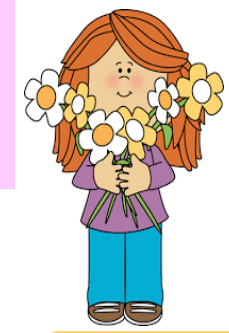
Personal Social and Emotional Development
 Talk with others to solve conflicts.
 Understand gradually how others might be feeling.
 Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed.

 To recite numbers past 5, link numerals and amounts.
 Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity

Expressive Arts and Design
 Respond to what they have heard, expressing their thoughts and feelings.
 Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.
 Printing using paints.

Understanding the World
 Plant seeds and care for growing plants.
 Understand the key features of the life cycle of a plant and an animal. Where is the best place to grow?
 Create a vegetable patch
 Observe the changes in the natural world – Seasons – Spring
 Use I-pads to take photographs of the natural environment and the different stages of a plant.

Possible role play area ideas
 Garden Center role-play, Cafe, Green Grocers, Farm Shop, The Giants Castle. Outside Garden Centre, Plant a Vegetable Patch, Garden Centre Café in the mud kitchen area. Following the children's excitement, engagement and interest.
